**POLLS ON ELECTION DAY ARE OPEN 7:00 AM – 8:00 PM AT THE GORDON TOWN HALL**

**VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT**

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may request to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

**TO OBTAIN AN ABSENTEE BALLOT YOU MUST MAKE A REQUEST IN WRITING.**

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the election. You may also request an absentee ballot by letter or online. **Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent ( if different), a copy of a photo id and your signature.**

Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk.

You can also personally go to the clerk's office, complete a written application, and vote an absentee ballot.

- The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is Wed., 09/19/2018 for the General Election.
- The deadline for making application to vote absentee by mail is 5:00 p.m. on Thurs., 11/01/18 for the General Election.
- The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is Fri., 11/02/2018 by 5:00 p.m. for the General Election.
- No in-person absentee voting may occur on the day before the election

Note: Wisconsin law not requires ballots to be returned by Election Day in order to be counted!
